Staffing Changes

Mme Keelan has joined us in Grade 6 and 5/6 on Fridays to cover a leave for Mme MacLennan until March break. Mme Drapeau has joined us in Grade 1 to cover Mme Rutledge's medical leave. Mme Everingham's position is being hired, following the earlier departure than expected for her maternity leave (Mme Everingham welcomed baby Beau to the world today!) This position should be hired by the end of the week.

Enrolment for 2024-25

We currently have 26 students enrolled for JK for next year and one for SK. Although this is considerably lower than this year, it is normal enrollment for this time of year. Our numbers are usually around 33-35 for September, with 2023-24 being unusually high at 44.

Professional Development

Our staff had two amazing presentations on the Professional Development Day at the end of October. Dr Hannah Beach spoke about trauma and connection, and the impact of trauma on children and their attachment with adults, and how this can present in their behaviour and actions. Dr Andrew B. Campbell (Dr ABC), a professor at OISE, spoke about anti-racist education and diversity in education, challenging us to ensure all students see themselves represented in our school and curriculum, and feel a sense of safety and belonging.

EQAO

Our 2023 EQAO results have arrived and been sent home to families. Our performance at the primary level was excellent, with continuing excellent growth at the primary level, placing us above the provincial average in all three areas, despite a slight dip in Math year over year. At both the primary and junior level (with the exception of Gr 6 Math), we were significantly above board average.

At the junior level, reading was just under the provincial average, and both reading and writing showed a slight decline. Our math scores at the junior level were not as strong as we would have liked and our Junior math teachers are working with Alison Dietze, a coach from the school board to help build student skills and support teachers in deepening mathematical understanding.
